Throughout this school year we have partnered with the 4H program through the University of Maine/Cooperative Extension to bring more STEM (Science Technology Engineering Math) opportunities to our classrooms. Recently, Ms. Cathy Bartlett Gray, from the UMaine/Coop. Extension brought STEM lessons to kindergarten classrooms. These lessons focused on water and floating as well as surface tension. Students engaged in an activity, "Drops on a Penny", which consisted of each student adding drops of water to a penny and counting how many drops it would hold. Students hypothesized if the flip side would hold the same number of drops and re-tried the experiment. Students greatly enjoyed these engaging hands-on lessons that are designed to promote interest and curiosity in STEM related topics.



Navigating the academic, social, and personal journey through elementary, middle and high school can be challenging for youth and their families. At various points, the stress of daily life can leave us feeling overwhelmed, stressed and/or discouraged about what the future holds. As parents and caregivers, we want the ability to connect with our children and help them feel confident that they can navigate through today's uncertain world.

In this training, Delvina Miremadi-Baldino, Ph.D., Ed.M., CAPP will examine the unique difficulties today's youth face, explore how we can foster their capacity for resilience and expand our toolkit of parenting resources to help families connect and thrive.

Delvina Miremadi-Baldino, (she/her/hers) is the Director of Resilience Strategy and Impact for the Maine Resilience Building Network (MRBN). Dr. Miremadi-Baldino brings over 18 years of experience in prevention and mental health promotion to advance MRBN's programming and impact. She is a Certified Applied Positive Psychology Practitioner, Certified Coach and mental health change agent and demonstrates this through research, education, program development, and entrepreneurship. In 2016 she founded Realize Your Resilience, LLC, a company dedicated to helping individuals, schools and organizations foster resilience through education, training, coaching and consultation.
