




To promote and ensure a safe and kind school community, our school will continue implementing a school wide Positive Behavior Intervention Supports (PBIS) System and Discipline Plan. This system falls under the umbrella of our Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) and has been in place at WCS for several years. MTSS/PBIS is a research and evidence based system of tools and strategies for defining, teaching, and acknowledging appropriate student behavior and correcting inappropriate student behavior. Consistent behavior expectations and procedures will continue to be taught like other subjects (math, reading).

As the building principal, I am currently making visits to each of the classrooms to discuss our school's PBIS System and Discipline Plan. At the conclusion of each visit, students are being given a packet of information to take home and share with their parents/caregivers. This packet includes a PBIS Parent Fact Sheet and WCS Discipline Procedures.

Our school has experienced tremendous growth in consistent positive behavior as a result of the PBIS System. I encourage parents/caregivers to review this information with their student(s) as a means of supporting your student and their learning environment.



Pooled Testing

Pooled Testing will begin at WCS on Tuesday, September 28th for staff and students with written parental permission. Concentric by Ginkgo, is providing the COVID-19 testing program. District staff with support from Concentric will oversee the testing.

As a reminder, Pooled Testing involves testing a group of individuals once a week. All students/staff in a pool swab their own noses (with supervision for young students) and place their swabs in a single test tube. The test tubes are sent to a lab for testing, and student information remains confidential and is not shared with the lab running the pooled test. If one of the pools test positive, then all members of that pool will be individually tested with a rapid test; and when the positive individual is identified, the student will go home. While all unvaccinated close contacts will still be required to quarantine from community activities, the advantage to Pooled Testing is any unvaccinated close contacts (individuals who have been exposed to someone who tests positive for COVID-19) participating in the program do not have to quarantine from school or school-related activities (i.e. school sports).

Parents must complete a consent form if they would like their student to participate. You can sign up for the program at any time and also withdraw at any time by reaching out to your student's school. To learn more, you can go to the Maine Department of Education COVID-19 Toolkit and look under Testing. Again, participation in Pooled Testing is completely voluntary and will require permission by parents/guardians. Students in grades one through five will participate in NWEA (Northwest Evaluation Association) Testing during the week of October 4th. Data from these reading, writing and



math results will be utilized to determine instructional programming for students. The NWEA will be administered in the winter and spring as a measure to monitor individual, grade level and school wide student growth and achievement. Results will be made available to parents during parent teacher conferences and/or first trimester report cards.

FOWC held its first meeting for the 2021-2022 school year on September

15th. Fundraisers this year that are being considered include a virtual basket auction, fudge sale and a Race for Education (spring). More details to follow. Wooden Playground Structure: It was also shared during the September 15th FOWC meeting that our school's wooden playground structure must be dismantled this fall due to it not being salvageable. The district's facilities department has determined that the area is safe for students to play on for now, but it will be dismantled at some point this fall during non-student time.

FOWC is working on a short and long term vision and plan for this area of the playground. This will require extensive fundraising and planning in a "phased process." <u>Community input and support for the overall vision and phases is needed and welcomed!!!</u> For now, the immediate plan is to install an amphitheater in the newly vacated area that will allow for outdoor instruction. FOWC will take care of the costs of the amphitheater and installation.

Thank-you WCS Community for working with our school staff to ensure a safe and orderly arrival and dismissal process. We know that on some days the arrival and/or dismissal process requires a lot of patience....especially if buses are running late!

Here are a few important reminders with a couple of revisions (highlighted in blue):

K-5 Morning Arrival

Bus Transportation:

* Buses will arrive between 8:40-8:50 A.M. with the exception of Wednesdays. Buses will arrive between 9:40-9:50 A.M. on Wednesdays due to the one hour late start.

Walkers: *Parents who walk their student(s) to school may drop off their children between 8:50-9:05 A.M. with the exception of Wednesdays. The drop off time for Wednesdays is 9:50-10:05 A.M due to the one hour late start.

Parent/Caregiver Transportation:

*Parents who are providing transportation for their student(s) may drop off their children between **8:50-9:05 A.M.** with the exception of Wednesdays. The drop off time for Wednesdays is **9:50-10:05 A.M** due to the one hour late start.

*PARENTS DROP OFF THEIR STUDENTS VIA THE MAIN ENTRANCE

*Students should exit their automobiles independently on the curbside and as quickly as possible so as not to hold up the arrival process (30 seconds maximum). *

*SAFETY CONES WILL BE PLACED FOR CAR DROP OFF POINTS

*PARENTS STAY IN VEHICLE UNLESS CHILD NEEDS ASSISTANCE

*PARENTS PLEASE WAIT FOR CARS IN FRONT OF YOU TO LEAVE

*If your child is unable to exit your automobile independently, please park in the WCS parking lot and assist your child. Parents/caregivers (wearing face coverings) must walk their student(s) to the Main Entrance. *This procedure should only be utilized by students who cannot exit their automobile independently.*

K-5 End of Day Dismissal

Bus Transportation:

*We will begin dismissing bus riders at 2:55 P.M. Our goal is for buses to dismiss between 2:55-3:10 P.M.

Parent/Caregiver Transportation:

*Parents/caregivers that are providing transportation for their student(s) may pick up their student(s) as soon as the last school bus/van has left the dismissal area or between 3:10-3:25 P.M. *Please note change in time.

PARENTS/GUARDIANS/CAREGIVERS PLEASE WAIT IN LINE FOR THOSE IN FRONT OF YOU TO LEAVE AND FOLLOW.

Dismissal Notes:

*THE DISMISSAL NOTE SHOULD INCLUDE DATE, STUDENT'S NAME, TEACHER'S NAME, PICK UP PERSON'S NAME

THE SECRETARIES IN THE OFFICE MUST RECEIVE A WRITTEN NOTE BY 1:00 P.M. DAILY FOR A STUDENT TO:

- *NOT RIDE THE BUS AND BE PICKED UP AT SCHOOL PARENT/GUARDIAN.
- * BE PICKED UP BY SOMEONE OTHER THAN THE PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN. IF SOMEONE OTHER THAN THE PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN IS PICKING UP YOUR STUDENT, PLEASE SUBMIT A NOTE TO THE SCHOOL OFFICE WITH THE FULL NAME OF THE DESIGNEE AND THEIR PHONE NUMBER.
- *IF A CHILD IS RIDING THE BUS TO OR FROM A LOCATION OTHER THAN HOME, PLEASE SEND A NOTE TO SCHOOL AND INCLUDE THE NAME OF THE BUS STOP AND THE NAME OF THE PERSON(S) GREETING THE CHILD.*
- *DUE TO TIME CONSTRAINTS AT THE END OF THE DAY, CHANGES IN DISMISSAL CANNOT BE MADE BY PHONE. LACKING WRITTEN NOTIFICATION OF CHANGES CHILDREN WILL GO HOME AS ESTABLISHED AT THE BEGINNING OF THE YEAR.
