






Book Review: <u>Dory Fantasmagory</u>, by Abby Hanlon (Puffin Books 2014)


<u>Dory Fantasmagory</u> is an entertaining series that 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> graders can read to themselves (Level L-M-N), but it is also a fun read aloud for any age. Dory is just starting school, and to her older brother and sister she's an annoying nuisance who is a target for their sibling teasing.

But Dory is funny and clever, and she turns her sibling's attempts to frighten her into her friendly, and hilarious monsters-turned-playmates. The whole family will enjoy and relate to Dory's creative and outrageous antics as well as the simple, engaging pictures. Some of the dialogue requires careful reading, and would be fun to read with children as theatre, too.

This series will provide lots of opportunities to discuss characters and feelings, and describe situations that will make grownups and kids alike chuckle in recognition. The little rascal Dory perfectly exposes the hopes and fears of any school child, and will keep children engaged and you wondering what she will invent next.
