


Hello WCS Community!





















Student Art

University of Maine/4H/Cooperative Extension Partnership

New Hours for the 2022-2023 School Year



Beginning this issue of the WCS Principal's Newsletter, we will feature a children's book reviewed and recommended by a WCS staff member.



"This Very Tree", a Chickadee Award winner, written and illustrated by Sean Rubin tells the story of a pear tree that lived between the World Trade Center's Twin Towers following 9/11. The book includes a note from the author/illustrator, along with a history of the events of 9/11 and information on the actual tree that survived.

I vividly remember the events of 9/11 as it was a day like no other in our country's history. When the 9/11 events took place, they were very real to me as I lived and worked in a community that was located in proximity to the tragic events. I visited the Twin Tower area a few months after 9/11 and saw the destruction and desolation firsthand. It is a memory that will never leave me. "This Very Tree" is a beautifully and sensitively depicted story of resilience, hope and growth during the tremendously difficult time in history. There was and still is much to learn from this time in history about resilience and restoration.
